Behavioral Response Team & Red Flag Reporting

Behavioral Response Team:

The Behavioral Response Team (BRT) is a cross-functional team of experts from across the university and is coordinated through the Office of the Dean of Students. The team reviews situations involving concerning behaviors (primarily involving students, but also employees, parents, guests, etc.— any situation that might impact the safety and security of the university community on or off campus).

What kind of issues are regularly reported to BRT?

Mild:

- Concerning excuses for missing classes
- Difficulty interacting with others
- Sudden changes in behavior

Moderate:

- Emotional reactions that seem intense for the circumstances
- Mental health concerns (anxiety, panic, depression, etc.)
- Unusual or demanding emails/ conversations

Extreme:

- Threats of harm to self or others
- Dangerous or disruptive behavior
- Assault, sexual misconduct, and other acts of violence

3. Be as detailed as possible; specific observed behavior, what was said, etc.*
